A long-time advocate of international cooperation and understanding, he served in public office for over three decades as the mayor of Minneapolis, Minnesota, U.S. Senator from the state of Minnesota, and Vice President of the United States.

The Humphrey Program is a Fulbright exchange program. Its primary funding is provided by the U.S. Government through the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs of the U.S. Department of State. The Institute of International Education assists the U.S. Department of State in administering the Humphrey Fellowship Program.

THE HUBERT H. HUMPHREY FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

A YEAR OF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT IN THE UNITED STATES

Practical professional experiences are the core of the Humphrey Program. Fellows design and implement individualized programs to acquire career related knowledge, interact with colleagues, and gain professional experience. This is supplemented by university classes, field trips, special workshops, and seminars with other Humphrey Fellows. Although Humphrey Fellows are affiliated with a university, the fellowship is not an academic degree program.

The Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program provides ten months of non-degree academic study and professional development in the United States. Humphrey Fellows are selected based on their potential for leadership and commitment to public service.

The Humphrey Program fosters a mutual exchange of knowledge and understanding about issues of common concern in the United States and other countries around the world. It offers valuable opportunities for education, leadership development, and interaction with American and international professional counterparts.

More than 4,400 men and women have been honored as Humphrey Fellows since the program was established in 1978. Approximately 200 fellowships are awarded annually.

Based on their professional interests, Humphrey Fellows are placed in groups at eighteen major host universities. These host universities are selected for their excellence in particular fields of study and for the resources and support they offer their Fellows.

Each host university has a Humphrey Program coordinator or coordinators. These individuals provide administrative support as well as academic and professional advice.

Humphrey Fellowships are awarded competitively to mid-career professionals in many fields, among them:

- Agriculture and rural development
- Communications/journalism
- Substance abuse education, treatment, and prevention
- Economic development/finance and banking
- Education administration, planning, and policy
- HIV/AIDS policy and prevention
- Human resource management
- Law and human rights
- Natural resources, environmental policy, and climate change
- Public health policy and management
- Public policy analysis and public administration
- Teaching of English as a foreign language
- Technology policy and management
- Trafficking in persons policy and prevention
- Urban and regional planning

All Fellows receive funding for:

- International and domestic travel
- Relevant courses, workshops, and seminars
- Accident/sickness health benefits policy
- A monthly maintenance stipend
- Supplies such as books and computers
- Professional activities

The Humphrey Program does not provide financial support for accompanying dependents.

The Humphrey Program creates a basis for establishing enduring links between Americans and citizens of other nations. It also leads to lasting relationships between program alumni. Humphrey Fellows return to their home countries reinvigorated by broader perspectives, enhanced leadership skills, and greater professional knowledge. The U.S. faculty, students, and community members who welcome Humphrey Fellows expand their own horizons as well by learning about Fellows' home countries.

Humphrey alumni can remain engaged with their Humphrey experience by applying for small grants from the Institute of International Education and the U.S. Department of State. These grants provide the opportunity to put to use the skills and knowledge acquired during the fellowship year by initiating community projects and furthering professional development after returning home.
